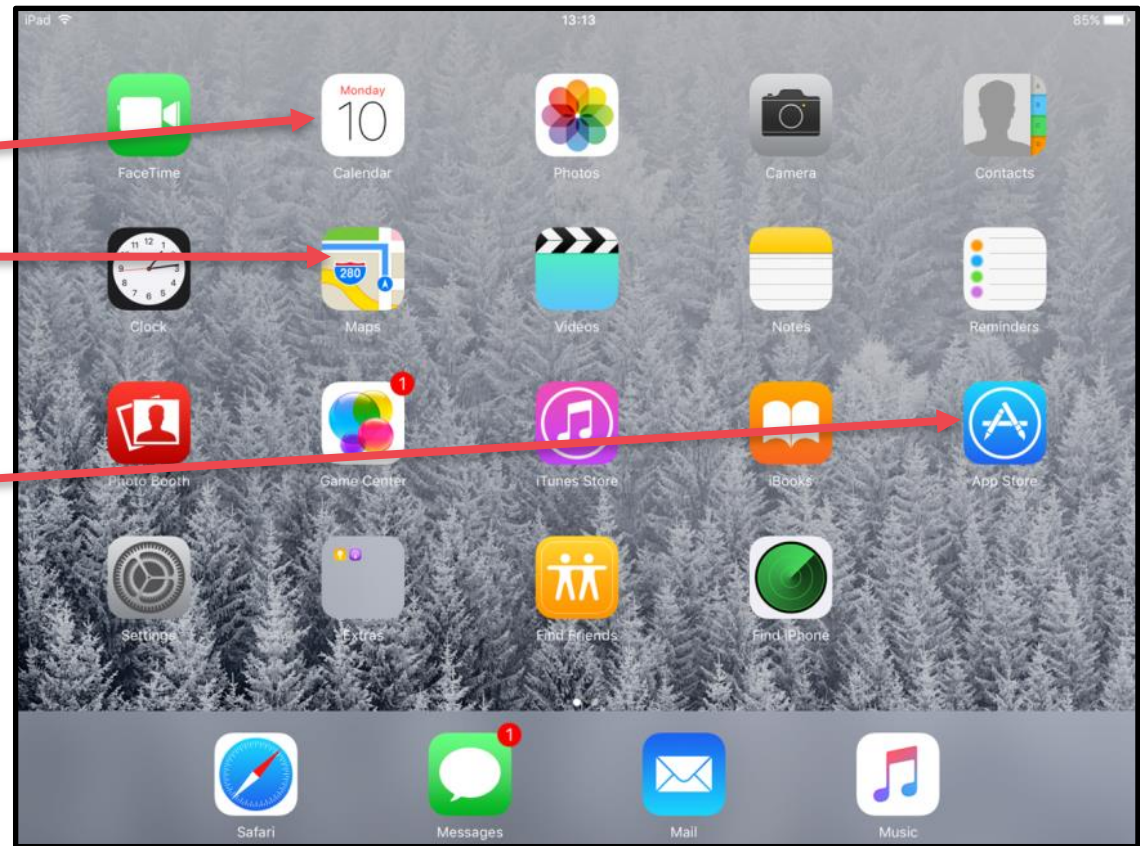

Apps on iPad

When you buy an iPad
it has only a few apps installed,
like a Calendar-app
and a Maps-app.

You can find more apps
from the **App Store**-app.

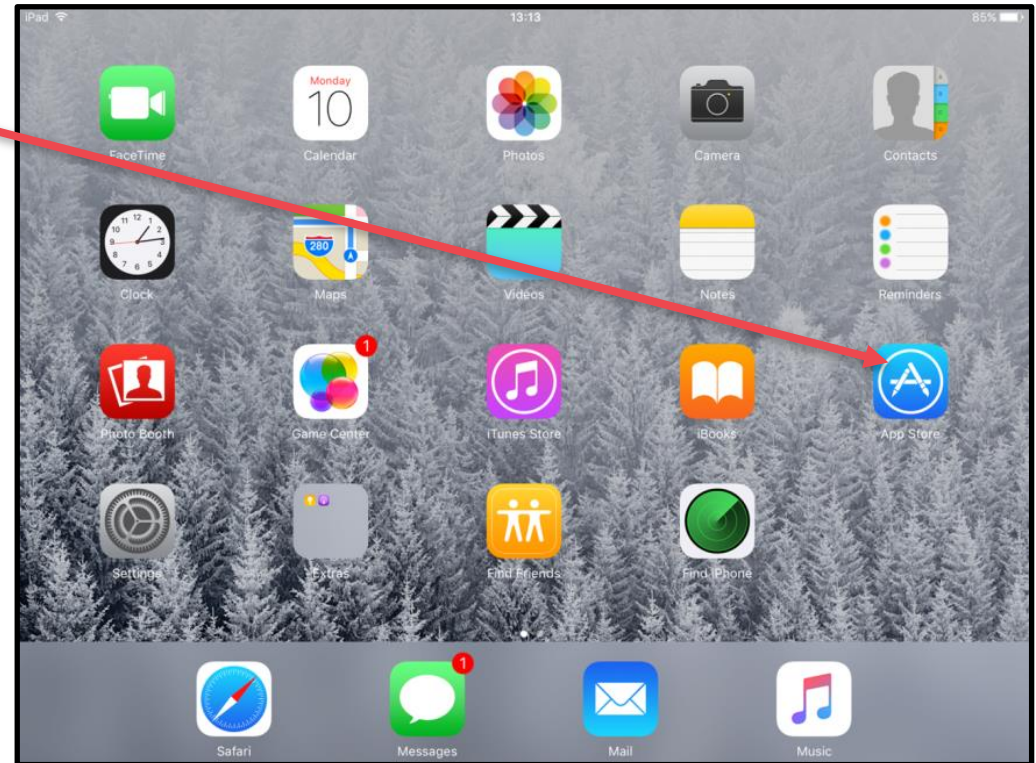
There are thousands of
different kinds of apps.
Many are free to download.
There are also apps
that you need to pay for.



Using the App Store

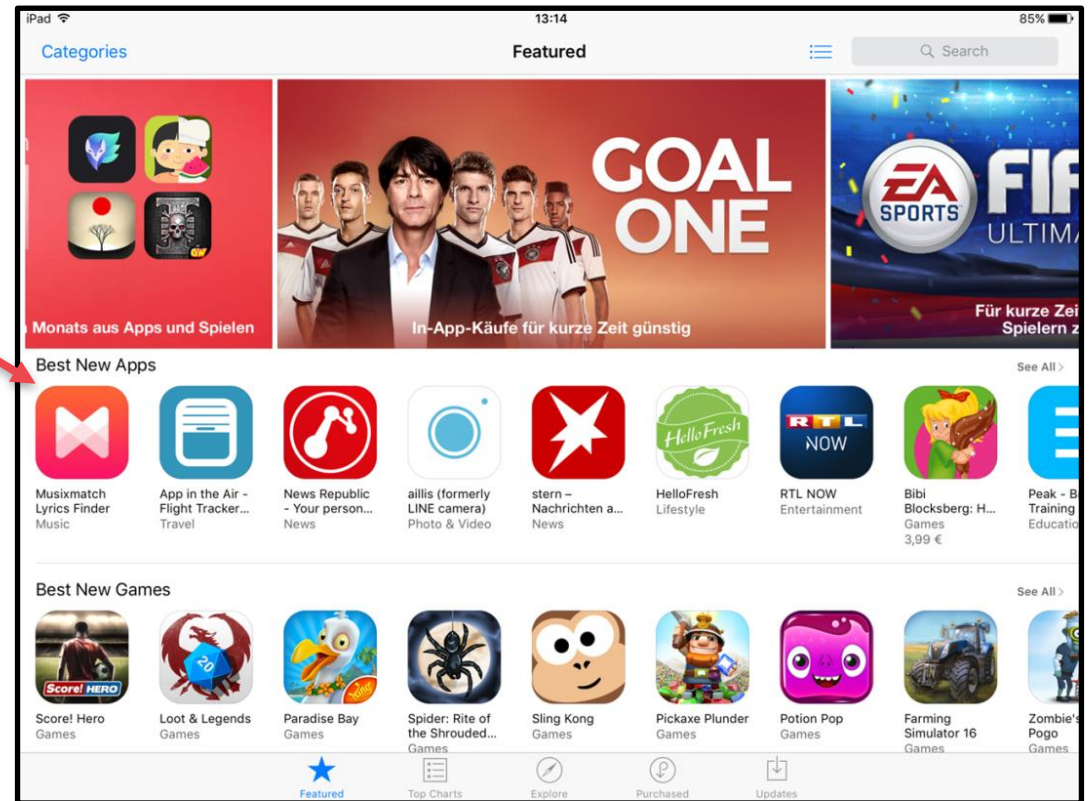
1. Open the App Store
by tapping on the **App Store**-app.

The App Store opens on your iPad.

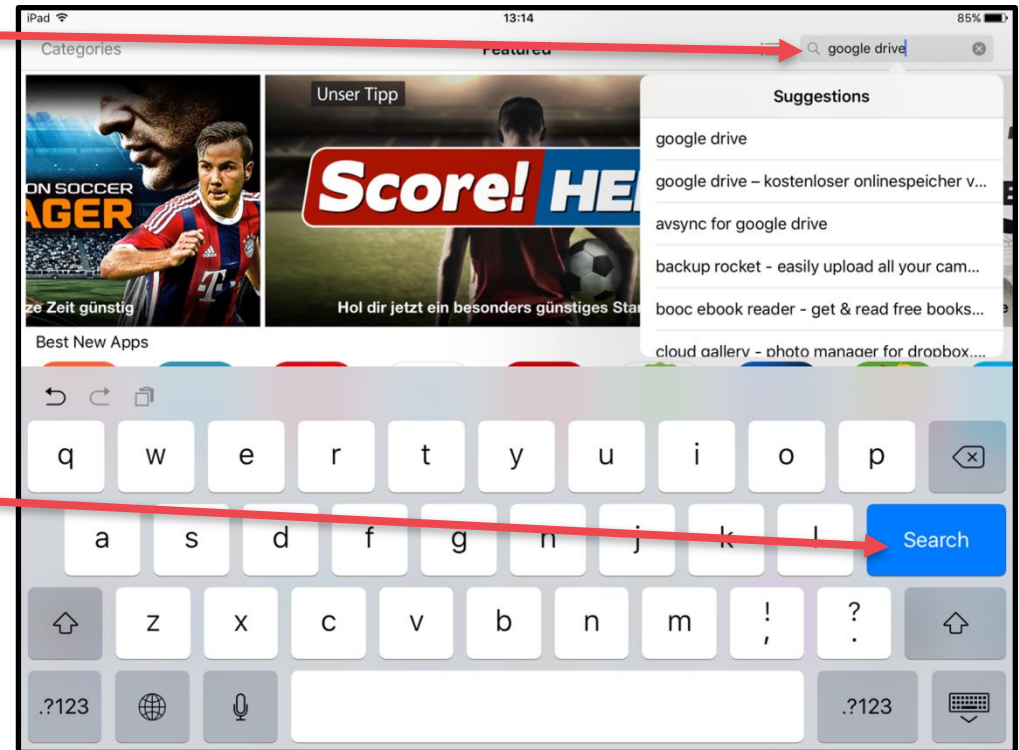


2. You will see several apps that are popular at the moment.

You can also search apps by name.

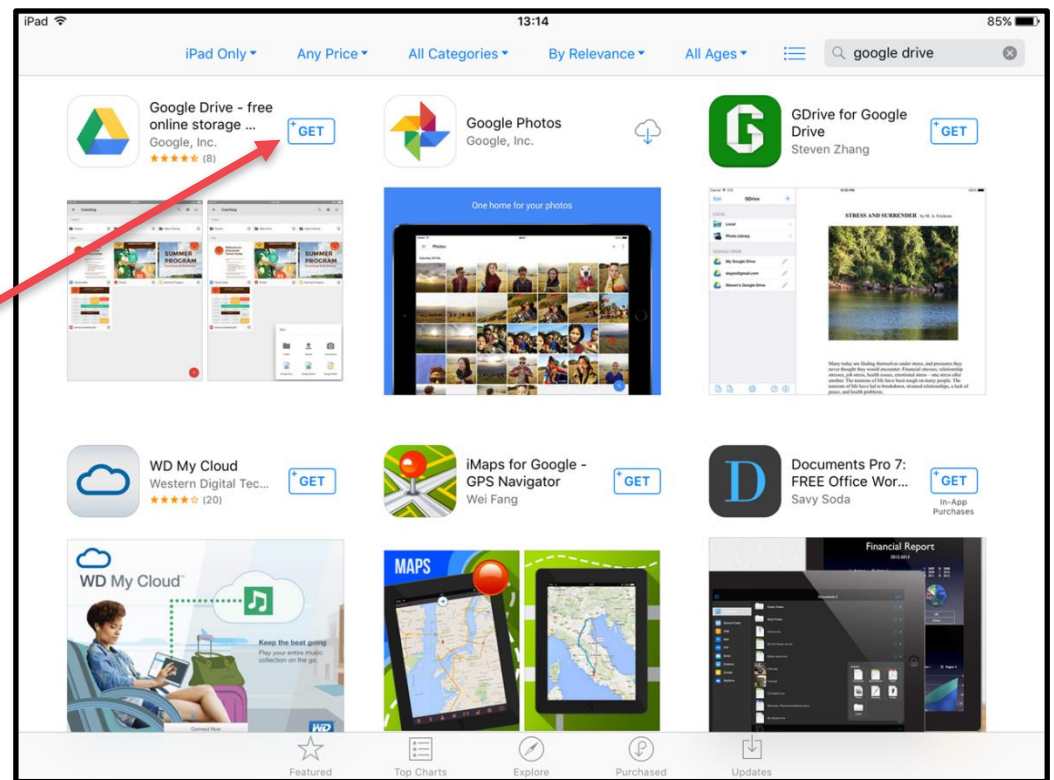


3. Tap on the **Search**-bar in the top right corner.
 4. Write the name of the app you want to find, for example Google Drive.
 5. Tap on the **Search**-key.
- Now you will see a list of apps.



6. Look for the app you wanted.
If you can't find the app you wanted,
do another search.
Use a different search word.

7. Tap on the **Get**-button
to start downloading the app.
The Google Drive -app
is free of charge.



Note:

If the app is not free,
you will see the price
inside the button.



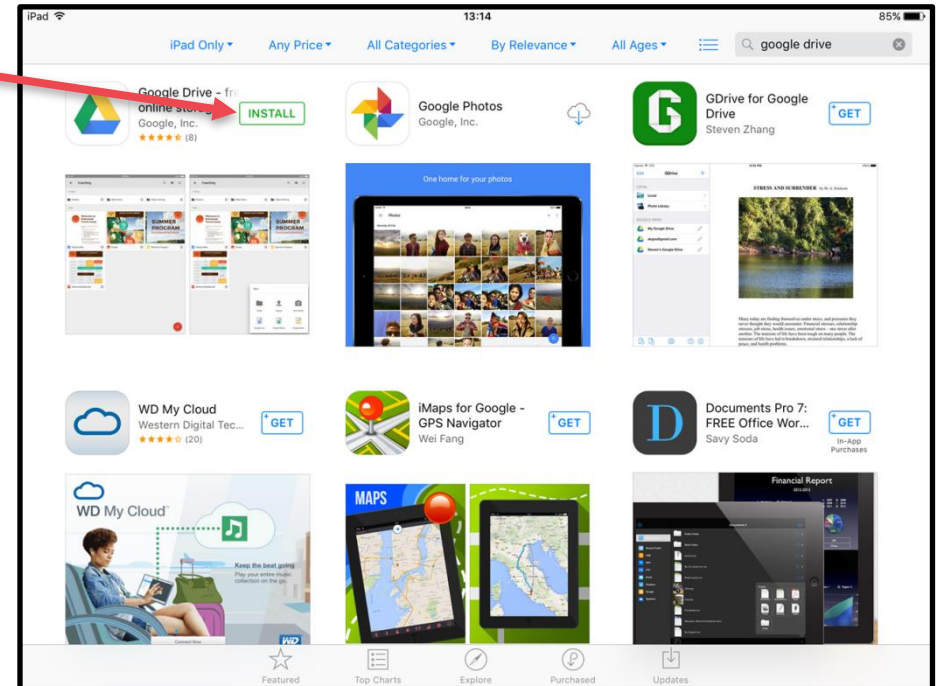
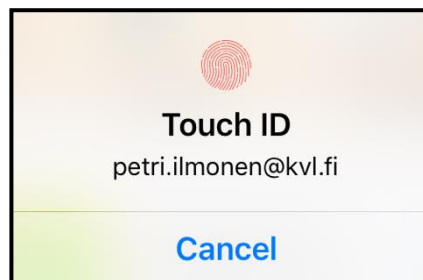
8. Tap on the **Install**-button.

It can take a few minutes for the app to download.

Note:

You may need to confirm the purchase.

By using the Touch ID fingerprint or enter the password.

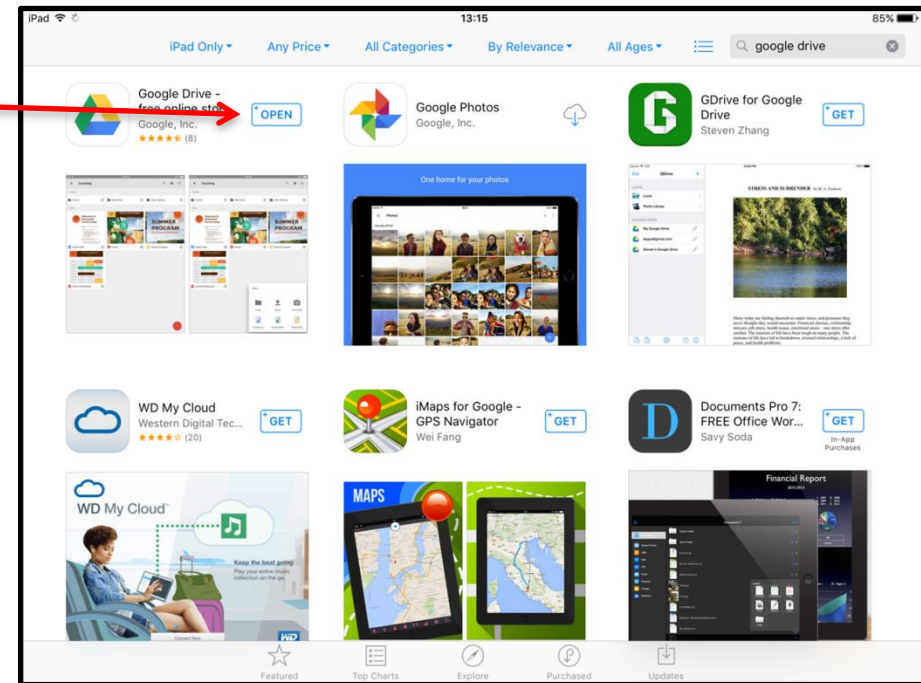


9. Once the download has finished, you will see an **Open**-button.

Now you have installed your first app.

10. Tap on the **Open**-button, the app will open.
