

Videos express messages in a very visual way.


People often think videos are an easier way to receive information than just photos and text.

messages you wanted to give.






3. Make sure the sound quality is good.

Use a microphone or speak close to the device.

Try not to have background noise when you are recording.







5. Video files are quite BIG.Remember thatthe longer the clip is,the bigger the file is too.

6. Plan your shoot carefully to get the best results.





7. Be the director

People need to know what to do:

- rehearse
- say 'quiet please' and '3 2 1 action' etc.
- encourage performances
- have fun
- re-take, if needed.



8. Remember the golden filming rules

- Keep cameras still.
 Use tripods and tables.
- Don't zoom, when you are recording.
- Hand hold shots only on the widest angle.
 Always move slowly and smoothly.
- Go closer to make things bigger.
- Record every video clip separately
 - clip by clip
