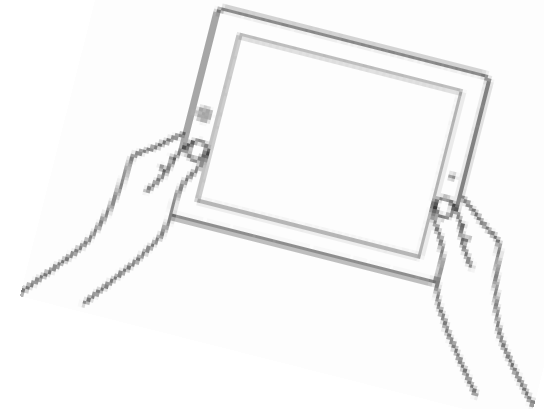
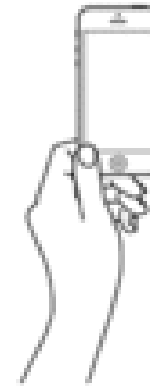

How to take photos with different devices

Most mobile devices like smartphones and tablets have an inbuilt camera that can take photos.

Each device works a bit differently, but this guide should help you to take a photo on your device.



Take a Photo

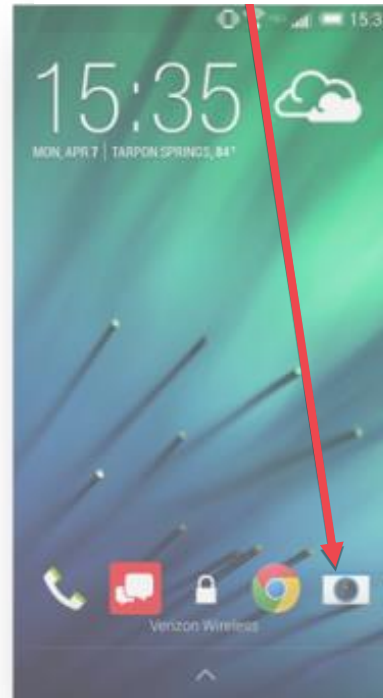
1. Look for a **Camera** app on your device.

It looks like a picture of a camera.

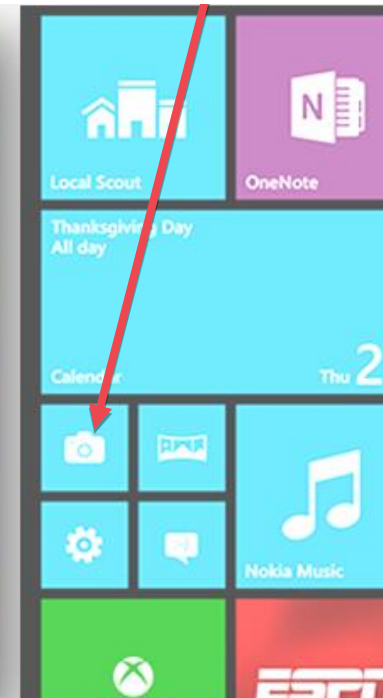
It is usually on the Home screen.

2. Tap on the **Camera** app. The Camera opens.

A Windows-phone



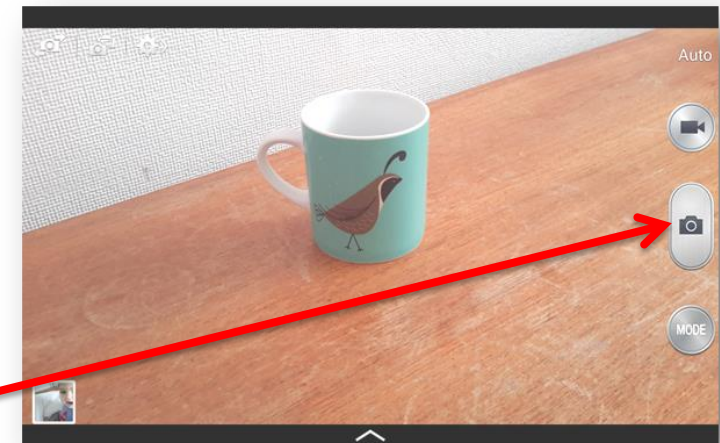
An iPhone



4. Position the camera.
Make sure that the thing you want to take a photo of is in the screen.
5. Tap on the **Take Photo** button.
The button looks a bit different on different devices.

The camera will take a photo.
Now you have your first photo.

Take a Selfie Photo

A selfie is a photo of yourself.

You can also have your friends in the picture with you.

Most selfies are taken in restaurants, shows and holiday trips.

You can take a selfie where ever you wish, but please respect other people's privacy.

Selfies are very popular.

Selfies are often shared on social media

like Facebook or Instagram.



If you want to take a selfie with your tablet or phone then you should switch the camera.

1. Tap on the **Switch Camera** button.
The camera on the screen side of your device is now active.
2. Tap on the **Take photo** button.
The camera will take a selfie photo.



Hint:

The screen side camera's quality is usually lower than the camera on the other side of the device.

Notice:

Some smartphones don't have a camera on the screen side of your device.
